GARDENING CLUB

Having run the Gardening Club for six years, due to Covid, spring planting took a back seat so I came up with a fun idea of creating miniature gardens.

Students have a small plot of land that they can work on their own or as a team. They have to plan, create, design, and build their own miniature garden over the coming weeks and have access to many different materials for example - wood, stone, moss, trees, shrubs, bushes, grasses, herbs, bedding plants, tin foil, plastic sheeting, lolly sticks, Lego, plastic army men and toy cars!

PE KIT


As you are aware, we launched the new Shirley High House system in September 2020. Despite the impact of COVID 19 it has been a real success! The House system has been inclusive of all students and has promoted sporting, academic and artistic endeavours throughout this academic year. A deeper sense of comradeship, teamwork and healthy competition has been nurtured, which has contributed to our thriving school culture.

To further raise the profile of the House system, we have updated our School PE kit for the next academic year. The changes to the PE kit will include a change of colour from navy with a gold trim to black with a white trim. The colours of the house system will also be incorporated into certain items of the PE Kit and students will need to purchase the PE kit based on the House they are in. Please note, whilst we would like to encourage you to buy

the new kit there is no expectation that you need to update your child's PE kit until he/she has grown out of their current PE kit.





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Mr Sahl-Taylor Director of Faculty Performing & Visual Arts / Music Specialist

Mr Sahl-Taylor spent 25 years as a professional musician. He toured throughout Europe including residencies in Spain, Croatia, Denmark & Sweden. He worked with many top recording artistes including American singer Ben E King (Stand by me). He has written & recorded his own album which was signed by ACM Records in New York. The album 'Hello World' is on itunes and Spotify.

In his role at SHS he has invited many top stars to perform for students including singers Deleelah and Scarlet Gabriel from Six the musical. ITV show 'The Voice kids' also regularly holds auditions in the school.

In 2017 one of his music students Rai-Elle Williams appeared on X Factor reaching the semi-finals of the live show. His Gospel Choir appeared on the show as Rai-Elle's backup singers. She now has a successful singing career. Every three years the department takes students to New York where they work with a Broadway director and perform their own show in the city.

Miss J Skeete Teacher in charge of Drama

Miss Skeete is our teacher in Charge of Drama. She trained in musical theatre and attended a stage school as a teenager, this allowed her to fall in love with the Performing Arts and she had the opportunity to perform in a number of West End venues. From a young age, she enjoyed performing and would often choreograph dance routines for her peers at Primary School and would write songs that she kept in her diary. A personal highlight was singing a rendition of Beyoncé's "Crazy in Love" with a live orchestra. Prior to teaching, a professional highlight of hers has been singing backing vocals in a Funk Soul band and being Scary Spice in a Spice Girls Tribute Band. Outside of teaching she is writing a musical which she hopes to be able to put on stage one day.

Miss K Hood Teacher in charge of Dance

Whilst attending a high school with performing arts college status, much like Shirley High School, Miss Hood's passion for dance performance was ignited. Even before completing her BTEC Dance, Miss Hood performed on various European stages including Sadlers Wells, the largest dance house in the UK, as well as a Mardi Gras production at Disney Land Paris. Upon completion of her Dance A-Level Miss Hood successfully auditioned for a role as a dancer in an internationally touring grand illusion show, where she was Choreographer and Head Dancer for 7 years. The Grand Illusion show gained notoriety after reaching the final stages of Britain's Got Talent, allowing them to perform private, corporate and professional shows, including a standout performance for the Sheik of Abu Dhabi at his private estate. Miss Hood completed an MA Degree in Choreography at one of the worlds most renowned dance schools, Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance and most recently completing teacher training at the Royal Academy of Dance.

Performing arts lessons at Shirley High School are taught in fantastic state of the art facilities. Dance, Drama & Music are taught once a week to all students at KS3. Students can then choose it as one of their options for GCSE.

Dance is taught in a dance studio with a sprung floor, fully equipped sound & light desk & floor to ceiling mirrors. Drama is taught in a dedicated studio newly installed in 2020, with a sprung floor and sound & lights desk. Music is taught in two large classrooms that are fully equipped with brand new iMacs. Here students work with music software GarageBand and learn the basics of piano*.

There are 5 practice rooms in the department, 1 computer suite, a dedicated drum room with a small stage and a recording studio with professional microphones for recording the students work. Further details are on our website.



FREE SUMMER CLUBS FOR CROYDON FSM STUDENTS - BOOKINGS NOW LIVE!

As part of the government's Holiday Activities and Food Programme (HAF), fun clubs will run throughout the summer in Croydon, offering free places to any pupils (5-16 years) who are eligible for and claiming free school meals.

Clubs will include a range of fun enrichment activities, free meals, local trips and opportunities to engage in physical activities such as dance, sports, swimming and more.

SUMMER HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES WITH PLAYPLACE

Play Place will be providing a wide range of activities and projects over the summer holidays and going forward that young people and families can participate and get involved in. Please see the following information within this newsletter.

HEADSTART ACTION

This is aimed at young people aged 14-18 years and at the stage where they are starting to think about careers, job opportunities and their future. HeadStart Action aims to bridge the link between social action and employability, engage and inspire young people, give them the skills, experience, connections, and need to get ahead in the world of work. The Course will run for 14 weeks on a Monday evening between the times of 6 pm to 8 pm at our main office: 21 Wayside, New Addington, Croydon, CRO 9DX.

Youth Employment Scheme (YES)

Our employment mentors will help support young people in gaining employment, apprenticeship, traineeship and/or further education. We are currently offering two different 12 week courses available to 16 -24 year old's. Alongside this, young people will gain employability skills in teamwork, team leadership, CV writing and interview techniques.

Mechanics: This Course is supported by CABS (Croydon Auto Bike Scheme), which helps young people develop their motorbike mechanic skills.

Childcare/Youthwork: This course helps to support young people to develop key skills for working with children and young people. The Course will run on Fridays between the times of 10 am - 12 noon for Childcare/Youthwork 12 pm to 2 pm for Mechanics course based at our main office (as seen above).

South London Girls Young Coaches Academy

This summer term, one Year 12, fourteen Year 10's and ten Year 9 students took part in South London Girls Young Coaches Academy. This exciting national initiative founded by Sport England and led by Youth Sport Trust is based on the power of female coaching and the impact of girls only sessions on increasing and sustaining participation in Physical Activity and sport. The Academy aims at empowering and inspiring girls and young women to become coaches and pursue their career in sport. The project was delivered by Agata Maj - South London Leadership, Coaching and Volunteering Lead from Croydon School Sport Partnerships and co-ordinated by Ms Hewlett. Sessions were a mixture of theory and practice and covered a wide spectrum of skills, including the importance of Fundamental Movement Skills in coaching, the basis of an excellent session, coaching journey, coaching philosophy, coaching analysis and many more. UNIFORM REMINDERS

The standard of uniform has been good in the main

It is important however that our students understand that our uniform does not change when they leave through the gates at the end of the day! It is to be worn correctly and with pride for the school they represent until they get home and take it off.

As we approach the Summer break please remember that any decisions made regarding extreme haircuts, extreme hair colours, piercings, excessive make-up (including false eyelashes) and coloured nail extensions, must be rectified in time for the students to be presented according to our uniform rules on the first day of the new academic year.

Please be advised, particularly in the case of piercings that, irrespective of the timing of the piercing, students will not be permitted to cover them, but will be asked to remove them at school. Notes from home asking for permission for the piercings to remain in or be covered with plasters etc will not be accepted. We accept one pair of stud earrings only. I would therefore suggest that this break is the ideal time to get new extra ear piercings, nose piercings or any other visible piercings, so that in September the piercings are healed enough for students to remove jewellery easily. The same principle applies for false eyelashes and coloured nail extensions which will not be permitted in school on our return in September, and I ask that you support us with this request to avoid the need for sanctions.



School skirts should be purchased from Hewitts and have either one or two front pleats only - no other style is permitted. There have also been issues with the permitted lengths so to clarify: skirt length should be on or about the knee. School trousers must be grey and be standard fitting school trousers. We do not allow black trousers. All students in Years 7 - 11 should be wearing a blazer.

Students in Years 7 – 11 should be wearing clip on ties only. The tie colours are; Year 7 green, Year 8 gold, Year 9 light blue, Year 10 silver, Year 11 red in September and they should be worn with our uniform to and from school.

Hair accessories (including headscarves worn for religious reasons only) must be navy, black, grey or white in colour only.

Trainers are not permitted to be worn with our school uniform. Students must wear school shoes that are wholly black, leather or leather equivalent and waterproof.

There are no major changes to our school uniform and if any item of school uniform needs replacing please purchase it from Hewitts – our uniform supplier. You can then be sure that the uniform purchased is both suitable and of the correct style for our school.

ORGANISATION

Please can parents / carers ensure that all students have a fully stocked pencil case, bottle of water and a reading book with them every day as well as the equipment they need for subjects such as Food Technology, PE, Dance etc.

All students must have a pencil case containing:

Pens (at the very least - 2 x black, 2 x green, 2 x red) Pencil (at the very least - 2 lead pencils) Rubber Pencil sharpener Ruler Glue



It is helpful for them to have a Math's set also as well as a small pair of paper scissors.

Being equipped and ready for lessons is very important and prevents the disruption of teaching and learning that occurs when a student does not have the right equipment with which to complete the lesson. We want to help get our students back on track with their learning and so disruption to this, caused by lack of equipment, is not acceptable.

Please also can you ensure that you see your child's student planner daily and sign it weekly. The planner is used as a weekly planner/diary as well as to communicate messages between home and school and record rewards and/or sanctions. The planner also contains information to assist our students with literacy, numeracy, learning skills and general information. Please take your time to familiarise yourself with the planner so that it can be used effectively as a source of information and as a means of communication between home and school. Students should have their planner with them every day.

PASTORAL Our Vision:

To develop aspirational learners who strive for excellence academically, creatively and culturally, benefitting from a wide range of opportunities led by inspirational educators.

I would like to thank parents/carers for their continued support with the attendance / engagement of their children during the lockdown and on our return. We are pleased and proud of the resilience of our students and the fact that the school attendance / engagement has remained so good. It has been even more important because those students who have attended / engaged throughout, are the students who will have any education gaps closed more quickly. This in turn will set them back onto that path of success we want for each and every one of them.

At Shirley High School we expect our students to achieve 96%+ attendance during each academic year. (This is the equivalent of 8 days off in the whole year.)

We do not authorise any absence during the academic year unless a Student Absence Request Form has been completed and is accompanied by the evidence required e.g. an Order of Service for attendance at a funeral, details of when the flight was booked for unforeseen emergencies requiring overseas travel etc.

Research suggests that 20 missed school days a year i.e. 10% non-attendance = 1 GCSE grade drop in achievement. This is without the effects of the 2 x National Lockdowns!

Attendance matters

100%	=	no days absence from school (September to July)
95%	=	10 days absence (2 weeks) from school (September to July)
90%	=	20 days absence (4 weeks) from school (September to July)
85%	=	30 days absence (6 weeks) from school (September to July)
80%	=	40 days absence (8 weeks) from school (September to July)

At Shirley High School we expect our students to have less than 3% lates in an academic year. (This is the equivalent of 6 late arrivals to school in the whole year.)

Punctuality to school is equally important to attendance and we are striving for all students to regularly attend school on time now that we have fully returned to school. Arriving to school on time sets our students up well for the day ahead as well as ensuring they access tutor time with their form tutors, which is where a lot of our pastoral work is undertaken. Poor punctuality has a detrimental effect on achievement as well as general organisation.

Our whole school punctuality is generally good and we are proud of the way our students have coped with the disruptions to public transport, the fluctuations of the timings and accessibility of the buses as well as adapting their routines to ensure they arrive at school for their staggered starts.

Research suggests that

5 Minutes late everyday = 3.4 school days missed per year 10 Minutes late everyday = 6.9 school days missed a year 15 Minutes late everyday = 10.3 school days missed a year 20 Minutes late everyday = 13.8 school days missed a year 30 Minutes late everyday = 20.7 school days a year

Thank you for supporting your children to attend regularly and on time. Please continue to support us and your child by ensuring their attendance remains above 96% and their punctuality remains less than 3% late, thereby allowing them to achieve their potential.

SECURITY

We are currently not allowing visitors to the school unless they have been invited in for a scheduled meeting. It is important that if parents are attending for a meeting that they report directly to reception during school opening hours, so they can be signed in and the appropriate checks and sanitising undertaken. Out of hours, visitors must use the entry system either at the school front gate or in Reception so that a member of the site team can meet them and monitor who is on site. Students will challenge or alert school staff; and staff will challenge any unauthorised visitors or non-Shirley students on site and direct them as appropriate to Reception to be signed in.



ATTENDANCE

200 students have achieved 100% attendance for this term (19th April, 2021 – 16th April, 2021). A fantastic achievement – well done!

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR

47 students have achieved 100% positive behaviour (ie no behaviour points) for this term (19th April, 2021 – 16th April, 2021). A fantastic achievement – well done!

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RULES RELATING TO MOBILE PHONES

Mobile phones are not permitted at Shirley High School – there have been no changes to this rule. They are not permitted on our site and this was made clear to all parents/carers on the admission of their children to the school. With this in mind, we are not responsible for the loss or theft of mobile phones on our premises should students break our rules and bring them into school. Any student found in possession or using a mobile phone on our premises will receive an amber level incident (-3 house points) and have the phone confiscated.



BEHAVIOUR

The majority of our students have maintained the high standards of behaviour expected at Shirley and have conducted themselves appropriately both in and out of school abiding by the new rules and regulations in place for maintaining a low risk Covid environment. The majority have also conducted themselves well during remote learning sessions.

We are committed to promoting a positive attitude towards our Golden Rule; 'Students are expected to show consideration and respect to all members of the school and local community at all times'. We will not tolerate any behaviour that disrupts the teaching and learning of our students or brings the good name of the school into disrepute.

Our students are aware of the Shirley Values and our expectation for them to consider and demonstrate them in their daily actions and behaviour.

We expect our students leaving school at the end of the day to make their way straight home, always respecting the public – pedestrian, motor, neighbours and local businesses. They should not go to the park or the park playground and they are expected to observe social distancing and wear their masks of travelling on public transport.

It is also really important that students use the zebra crossing rather than crossing in front of oncoming vehicles. Please can parents who drop their children off in the morning please park safely on the main road and not obstruct the zebra crossing or our neighbours' driveways. No parents / carers should drive into the school to drop students off unless a special arrangement has been made.

Student behaviour and our school uniform should not and must not change outside of school. We hold the same high expectations of our students in school and out. The reputation of our school is important and affects all of us. Students' behaviour on the way to and from school reflects on all of us. We do not want our students to behave in a way that will embarrass the school and bring the name of our school into disrepute.

Parents / carers' role in this cannot be underestimated and your support in helping us educate our children in regards to their behaviour is really appreciated.

The school's Behaviour Policy is available for reference on the school website and a copy of the school rules relating to; attendance and punctuality; general behaviour; the safe use of school premises; uniform; and prohibited and banned items is also available in the student planner.

Off The Record are a young person centred organisation offering counselling and emotional support. They have recently added a new online counselling



service to Off The Record's other support services (all detailed on the Off The Record website).

Whilst some young people may prefer face to face counselling, there also a number of young people who find it difficult to engage with this type of support for a variety of reasons, including school refusers. Off the Record are looking for ways to get information about their free online counselling service to young people, so any suggestions you may have for them would be welcome. Currently they have the capacity to take on new clients and their commitment to the local CCG who fund them is that those who register, will have contact within 48 hours and will start to work with a counsellor within 5 working days.

The service is text based, via their secure website, so may not be suitable for those who find reading and writing too challenging or do not have access to a laptop or tablet. They believe passionately that the relationship between counsellor and client is central to the counselling that they offer and this is no different in their online service where young people work online with a counsellor in weekly sessions.

All of their counsellors are qualified face-to-face counsellors who have undergone additional training to work effectively in the online environment. Young people can register independently, please use the link on our website.

Live Streaming of Sexual Offending – CEOPS Education Team Briefing

As well as directing you to our new resources on Live Streaming #LiveSkills that can be used to educate children, young people, parents and carers about Live streaming, it was important that we address the behaviour of sharing images and videos of sexual abuse.

For professionals and parents finding out that images and videos of abuse are being circulated by young people and adults on social media, it can be a stressful time and difficult to know what course of action to take immediately. Here are some clear steps to take and important things to remember:

- Please never share a video or image depicting any kind of abuse involving children
- Each time a video or image of abuse is shared it re-victimises the child and increases the likelihood of blackmail, feelings of selfblame and powerlessness
- Report it to the platform it has been shared on e.g. YouTube, Facebook, Snapchat, Instagram etc
- Report it to CEOP if it is an image or video of sexual abuse involving a child with a link to where the video or image is hosted e.g. YouTube, Facebook.
- If it's not on a public platform and in only exists on a device i.e. Phone, tablet. Once reported, with authorisation of CEOP or the Police, delete it from the device it has been sent to (if offender usernames are visible make note of them)
- Encourage other people to report if it is being shared publicly

If you work in a school or college and are concerned about what to do with peer to peer sharing of sexual images or videos you can refer to the 'Sexting in schools and colleges guidance'

If a parent or carer is worried about a child seeing inappropriate things online, 'Thinkuknow/parents' has more information.
