Key Stage 3 Information

In Year 7 and 8 we cover a chronological scheme of work which covers Medieval to 20th century British and World history. At Key Stage 3 students are taught skills and knowledge that will help to ease the transition to the GCSE course in Year 9. Various skills are assessed through essay writing and source analysis.

Key Stage 4 Information

In Year 9, 10 and 11 students study and then Superpower relations and the Cold War 1941-91, Weimar and Nazis Germany 1918-39, Anglo-Saxon and Norman England 1060-1088 and Crime and Punishment through Time 1000-present. Students begin preparing for their GCSEs in Year 9 where they study America and Russia before World War One.

Key Stage 5 Information

Students study Revolutions in early modern and modern Europe which includes Britain, 1625-1701: conflict, revolution and settlement followed by Russia in Revolution, 1894-1924. In Year 13 they study Mass media and Social change in Britain, 1882-2004. Their course work unit is on the Tudor State where they examine the views of leading historians and ongoing historical debates.

Out of school activities

We have run trips to the First World War Battle fields, Mountfitchet Castle, the Imperial War Museum and the Museum of London as well as trips around Croydon to highlight local historical studies. We have also attended A level conferences in London.

Any other information

Pupil's knowledge and skills are assessed every half term and in the end of year summer exam. We particularly focus on the National Curriculum concepts to ensure pupil make progress to the next stage.
