 <b>Shirley High Curriculum Map</b>	<i>Year 8: The Emerging Artist: students will learn the knowledge, understanding and skills to produce work in two and/or three dimension exploring their ideas and recording their experiences with emerging independence. They will demonstrate emerging skills in formal elements of art and principles of design. They will learn to draw, paint, sculpt and design with emerging skill. They will learn to evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design. They will learn about great artists, craft makers and designers, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art forms and complete artwork inspired by works of others.</i>
