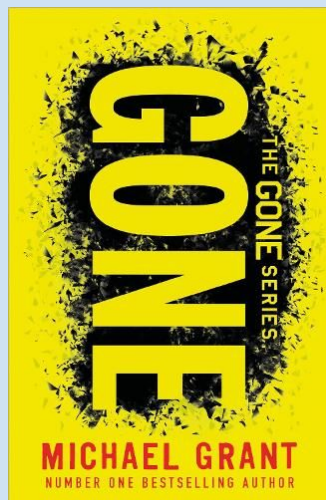

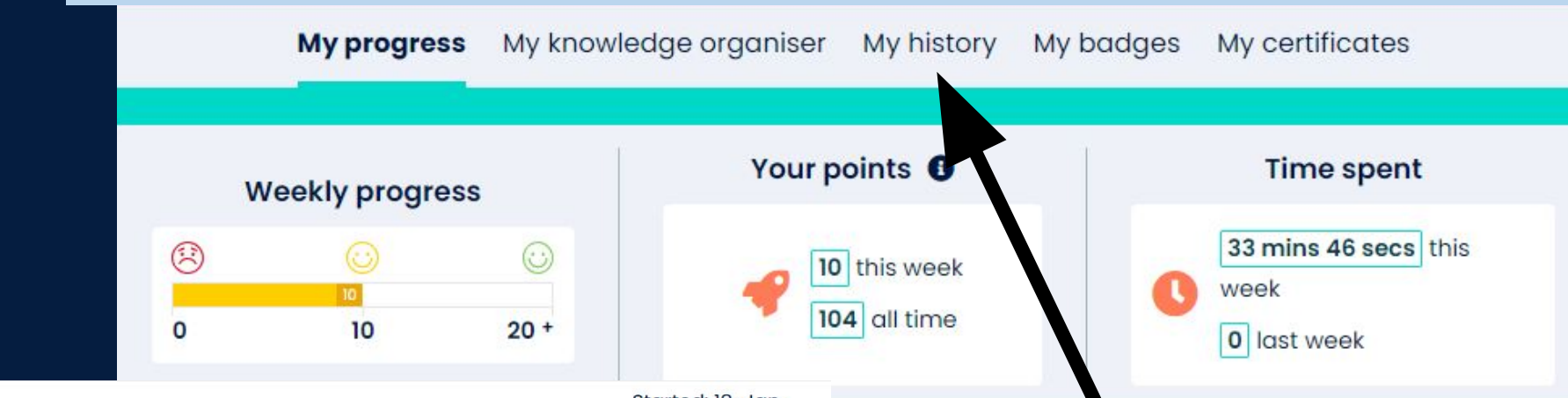

If you arrive at/by Crystal Palace station follow the route marked out by the red line. Go along the bridge next to the arena, down the steps and enter by the red arrow on the picture.

If you arrive at or get of the bus at Penge West station follow the route marked in blue through the park towards the sports arena to the entrance.

Change at Croydon arena

Get off at Penge West station

Walk through the park towards the athletics track

From New Addington

Tram to Sandilands

Change platforms

Get the tram from Sandilands to Beckenham Road

227 bus to penge west station

Walk through the park towards the athletics track

From Thornton Heath

Get the 450 bus towards Lower Sydenham

Get off at Westow Hill

Walk towards the park/Crystal Palace station

Walk through the park towards the athletics track

From South Norwood

197 Bus towards peckham

Get off at Penge West station

Walk through the park towards the athletics track

From East Croydon

Get the 197 bus towards Peckham

Get off at Penge West station

What you need to bring to sports day

Wear your SHS PE kit and suitable trainers

If you arrive in crocs/sliders you must have trainers or athletics spikes to change into for your events!

Crocs in sports mode do not count as suitable trainers!

You can wear a top in your house colour but it must be appropriate e.g. a red Liverpool top if in creators (no crop tops/vests/shoulders or tummy showing!), however you **MUST** wear the black SHS PE shorts/bottoms (NO cycling shorts/leggings).

Water/lunch/sun cream/sun hat

If you fail to wear an appropriate top, or shorts, we will provide you with our brightly coloured spare kit to wear for the day!
