I think many of our students were particularly inspired by one of the first year students who showed us around as she was very down to earth and honest completely dispelling any preconceived ideas that they had of an Oxford student.

Revision Conference for Sixth Form Exam Students - Learning to Relax



On Tuesday 19 March 2019 the Sixth Form team provided a series of workshops to support all A level students for the upcoming examinations. The Sixth Form Tutors and Heads of Year worked together to plan and deliver sessions on relaxation during exams and energising beforehand, command words in examinations, and how to answer questions when these words are used.
