WORK EXPERIENCE YEAR 10

As part of our Careers programme all Year 10 students are expected to have placements confirmed for Work Experience from 2 July 2018 for two weeks. This is a very important part of their education

Young people are more likely to be successful in their careers search if they have completed some good work experience. It is a perfect way to sample all the career options out there. It is a way of exploring different jobs without actually committing to anything. Doing work experience shows passion and interest. Evidence that you have done work experience shows an employer or university or college that you are motivated to get into a chosen career and that you have done your homework. It gently introduces you to the world of work. It will help you identify your own skills and perhaps even highlight the areas that you might want to work on. Work experience is not always possible in the area you are interested in, but it may provide evidence of using the necessary skills e.g. Teamwork, Communication Skills and Leadership Skills.

On Thursday 10 May 2018 a group of Year 10 students visited Mansfield College Oxford.

After a slow journey we arrived at the college where our students were impressed to see a University embossed sign, proclaiming the visit of Shirley High School, for all to see! We were met by the Academic and Admissions Manager who was our host for the day and taken to a classroom where a selection of tea and biscuits were offered ("wow, cups and saucers", some were heard to say, whilst for others the first challenge of the day was how to make their own cup of tea!).



A presentation about the university and its entry requirements followed. Many were surprised that currently 90% of students at Mansfield came from state schools and that they were looking for students with a passion for their subject rather than students with a wide range of different experiences and interests. Three current students from the university then led a Q & A session. Our students were a bit reticent at first but once Valentin Njorka 10E had asked the first question many more followed curious to know about college life!

A tour of the university followed. The library (which is open 24hrs a day) was stunning: students were in awe of its ornate decorations and carvings as well the silence. We were also shown the common rooms, student kitchens and café in the Crypt. Again our students were impressed that many students studied in the cafe, listening to their headphones and using their laptops again quietly.

Lunch was provided by the university and was taken in the Refectory, "Just like Hogwarts", one student was overheard saying and they were right. The choice of food was varied; some tried pheasant for the first time, whilst others chose 'safer' dishes of chicken rice and peas, belly pork or the vegetarian option.

Finally we returned to the classroom - here a fascinating lecture was given by the senior lecturer for Medieval English. ur students impressed her with their higher order questioning and interest in the subject.

Altogether this was a very successful day - all the students behaved impeccably and were a pleasure to be with. They said the trip had inspired them to go to university and to aim high for an Oxford University place-

The Senior Mathematical Challenge (SMC) is run by the UK Mathematics Trust. The SMC encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. It is aimed at those in full-time education and with sufficient mathematical competence to undertake a post-16 course.

The problems on the SMC are designed to make students think. Most are accessible, yet still challenge those with more experience; they are also meant to be memorable and enjoyable.

Mathematics controls more aspects of the modern world than most people realise - from iPods, cash machines, telecommunications and airline booking systems to production processes in engineering, efficient distribution and stock-holding, investment strategies and 'whispering' jet engines. The scientific and industrial revolutions flowed from the realisation that mathematics was both the language of nature, and also a way of analysing - and hence controlling - our environment. In the last fifty years, old and new applications of mathematical ideas have transformed the way we live.


All these developments depend on mathematical thinking - a mode of thought whose essential style is far more permanent than the wave of technological change which it has made possible. The problems on the SMC reflect this style, which pervades all mathematics, by encouraging students to think clearly about challenging problems.

The SMC was established as the National Mathematics Contest in 1961. In recent years there have been over 110,000 entries from around 2,200 schools and colleges. Certificates are awarded to the highest scoring 60% of candidates (Gold:Silver:Bronze, 1:2:3).

The UK Mathematics Trust is a registered educational charity, founded in 1996, with a small professional core of administrators, but with much of the work done by several hundred volunteers, mostly school teachers, university students and academics.
