Outstanding Post 16 Results 2017

This summer, I was privileged to see a very large number of extremely happy Sixth Form students open their results slips already knowing they had got their first choice university or higher apprenticeship. The students excelled themselves with A level students achieving 83% A*-C grades (45% of which were A*-B) and 98% of the level three BTEC students achieving Distinction*-Merit (84% of which were Distinction* - Distinction). The pass rate for the year group was 100% pass rate. 2017's results continue to confirm our place as one of the countries leading Sixth Form providers, particularly for Value Added Performance at Key Stage 5; A level results were in the top 10% and BTEC results in the top 1%.

Many students are now enjoying their first few weeks at university and have since sent warm messages to the staff at Shirley

High School thanking them for their support and help along the way.



About The Group

The committee was established in 1990 by a gathering of volunteers in response to a television appeal reporting the deprivation experienced by children and their families in Romania.

Who The Group Helps

The underlying dispatch was to work with nearby authorities to convey genuinely necessary supplies to orphanages, children's homes, schools and churches.

Extra Help

This enlarged into giving extra support to socially disadvantaged as well as disabled children and their families at home.

How The Group Helps

Volunteers collect 'shoe boxes' from churches at Christmas, containing items, such as, gloves and hats, fundamental toiletries, and little presents to lighten up Romanian children's lives. Family boxes with basic needs and toiletries are likewise liberally donated and collected by volunteers. These are altogether transported to Comanesti by truck and distributed to the children by the BHRG volunteers who make deliveries to schools, institutions, and straightforwardly to needy families.

Going The Extra Mile

In the summer BHRG volunteers help to run activities for the children at the Centres which include games and workshops.

When required, volunteers also carry out local projects, such as refurbishment of the Centres, supporting specific short-term needs and responding to crisis situations within individual families.

How You Can Help!

All money raised goes specifically to help children and their families in Romania. The general population who work for the BHRG get no fees and volunteers support their own flights and living costs when working in Comanetsi.

At the point when money is donated every last bit of it goes to the needy in the area. Money is urgently required to support the running of the focuses, and activities of the BHRG. It is additionally used to give numerous sorts of emergency support to deprived families undergoing emergencies.

Overall we had a great response from our school as a whole, receiving help from many students who were willing to donate anything in order to create smiles on the faces of children less fortunate than ourselves.
